The Word of the Lord from Romans 8:15-17, 26-27

For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear,
but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we
cry 'Abba! Father!' The Spirit himself bears witness that we are
children of God, and if children, then heirs – heirs of God and
fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with Him in order that
we may also be glorified with Him. Likewise, the Spirit helps us in
our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought,
but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for
words. And He who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the
Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the
will of God.

The Heidelberg Catechism Question & Answers 120-121

Why has Christ commanded us to address God thus: OUR FATHER?
To awaken in us, at the very beginning of our prayer, that filial
reverence and trust toward God, which are to be the ground of our
prayer; name that God has become our Father through Christ, and
will much less deny us what we ask of Him in faith, than our
parents refuse us earthly things (*Is. 49:15; Mt. 6:9; Lk. 11:11*).

Why is it added, IN HEAVEN?

That we may have no earthly thought of the heavenly majesty of
God; and may expect from His almighty power all things necessary
for body and soul (*Jer. 23:24; Acts 17:24; Rom. 10:12*).

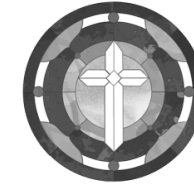
